City Administrator Retires



Bret Heitkamp, City Administrator, Retires after 38 Years of Service to the City, 26 as City Administrator

After nearly four decades of dedicated service, Bret Heitkamp has retired as City Administrator, concluding an extraordinary 38-year career with the City—including 26 years in the City's top leadership role. His tenure was marked by steady leadership, vision, and an unwavering commitment to the growth and well-being of the community.

Throughout his time with the City, Bret played an instrumental role in shaping long-term development, enhancing public services, and fostering strong civic partnerships. Under his guidance, the City experienced significant expansions in parks and recreation, public safety improvements, infrastructure upgrades, and thoughtful strategic planning that laid the foundation for sustainable growth.

Bret began his journey with the City of Champlin in 1986 as Parks & Recreation Director, later stepping into the role of City Administrator in 1999. His tenure oversaw a remarkable transformation, including the growth of Champlin's population from 14,600 to nearly 25,000, and the expansion of residential neighborhoods such as The Woods, Highpointe, and Emery Village.



Jerry Hart Named 2025 Father Hennepin Festival Grand Marshal - Retiring June 2025

The City of Champlin proudly announces Jerry Hart as the 2025 Father Hennepin Festival Grand Marshal. After more than four decades of dedicated service, Jerry will retire this June, capping a remarkable career that began in 1983 and has left a lasting mark in protective inspections.

Jerry's journey into public service took a turn after an injury shifted his original plans to study business administration. In 1983, he enrolled in architectural drafting and estimating at Dunwoody Institute and began working as a summer building inspector for the City of Champlin. His position became full-time in 1984 after he passed the State Certification exam for residential inspections, thanks to evening classes at North Hennepin Community College. Over time, he earned additional credentials to inspect both residential and commercial buildings (excluding electrical), gaining a deep understanding of the city's development.

From 1984 to 1999, Jerry served as a field inspector, playing a key role during Champlin's significant growth period. In 1999, he was appointed Building Official, a role he has held ever since. Throughout his career, Jerry has helped ensure the safety and quality of countless structures across Champlin and worked closely with city staff and residents.

As he prepares to retire, the City is honored to celebrate Jerry's decades of service and dedication by naming him Grand Marshal of this year's festival. Please join us in recognizing Jerry Hart—a faithful public servant whose work has helped shape the community we know today.





Road Projects

Construction is taking place in a few areas this summer. The 109th Avenue reconstruction project includes the construction of a 4-lane divided roadway with curb and gutter from Winnetka to Jefferson Highway. Intersection improvements include the addition of turn lanes and signal improvements at Highway 169, upgrades to the current signal at Winnetka, the addition of a signal at Xylon Lane N, and the construction of a roundabout at Jefferson Highway. The Goose Lake Parkway and Highpoint Park neighborhood project includes street reconstruction, spot curb replacement, trail replacement, and utility improvements. The Jefferson Highway project will include street mill and overlay, spot curb replacement, sidewalk and trail repairs, signal improvements, and minor utility improvements. Residents can learn more, view detour maps, and sign up for project emails by scanning the QR Code.

Organics Curbside Collection

Starting July 1, residents will have access to organics curbside collection as part of Hennepin County's zero-waste initiative. Organics comprise 25–35% of household waste, and diverting them to composting helps reduce landfill waste, lower greenhouse gas emissions, and improve soil quality. All cities are required to make organic recycling available to households with curbside service. This requirement is part of Hennepin County's recycling ordinance updates, finalized in

November 2018. While participation in the organics program is voluntary, residents in communities offering the service are required by state law to pay for it—just as they do for curbside recycling. The goal is to reduce waste and promote composting, which provides significant environmental benefits. We encourage residents to use this service to help keep our community sustainable.

How do I collect organics for recycling?

The city will provide an outdoor organics collection container. To request one, scan the QR code and complete the registration. Your hauler will deliver it to your home. Weekly curbside collection begins in July 2025. Once you receive your curbside organics collection container, you can start organics recycling!

Where do I get bags?

Use the voucher to pick up one free box of 3-gallon kitchen compostable bags at Grady's Ace Hardware, located at 12325 Champlin Drive. Bags will be provided by the City of Champlin while supplies last. It is important to use BPI-certified compostable bags to collect items in a kitchen bin before transferring them to your outdoor organics collection container.



What You Need to Know:

- Mandatory Service Charge:** Starting in July 2025, a monthly organics fee of **\$3.85** will be added to every eligible resident utility bill.
- Accepted Materials:** Food scraps, compostable paper, and certified compostable products. View the organics recycling guide on page 10.
- Collection:** Recycling is collected on the same day of the week as your refuse.
- Container Storage:** Must be properly stored in accordance with City Code Chapter 46 – Solid Waste, Section 46-21(c). Containers may be stored inside, in the side yard, or in the back yard without screening. They may not be stored in the front yard.

"I am excited to be a part of the Champlin organization," she said. "I look forward to getting to know the staff, city council, and community."



Boat Removal Protocol at Mississippi Point Park

Help prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species by following these steps:

- Clean:** Remove plants, animals, and mud from your boat, trailer, prop, and equipment. Use the CD3 machine at the boat launch.
- Drain:** Empty the motor, bilge, live well, ballast tanks, and any other water containers, including canoes and kayaks.
- Dry:** Ensure everything is completely dry to kill any remaining organisms.
- Dispose:** Throw unwanted bait in the trash (not in the water) and drain bait bucket water onto vegetation, not hard surfaces.

Canines for Clean Water

Pet ownership comes with many responsibilities, and picking up pet waste, though not fun, is essential to protecting our water quality. When pet waste isn't disposed of properly, it washes into storm drains, which lead directly to lakes, rivers, and streams. This adds harmful nutrients to the water, causing algae blooms and making it unsafe for swimming. Pet waste also introduces bacteria like E. coli, leading to beach closures and health risks for people, pets, and wildlife.



Cleaning up after your pet may seem small, but it's a significant step in protecting our water and ensuring safe, enjoyable summers for all. Plus, it's the law. Keep our waters clean by scooping the poop!
