Type of Administrative MRCCA Review Request

\$50 fee is required for all MRCCA Administrative Review Permits

- Construction of building, structure, addition, deck or other building alterations with any PCA
- Riprap, retaining walls and other erosion control structures – Construction or replacement within BIZ and WQIZ**
- Land Alterations more than 10 cubic yards of material or more than 1,000 square feet in area within WQIZ**
- Sewage treatment system – installation or alteration
- Vegetation removal or vegetation restoration within any PCA**
- Interim or temporary uses within any PCA
- Ramps, private water access, or viewing facilities within any PCA
- Stormwater management facilities within BIZ or WQIZ
- Water Oriented Accessory Structure

** See supplemental application required (either vegetation management or land alterations)

Primary Conservation Areas (PCA):

- BIZ: Bluff Impact Zone
- SIZ: Shore Impact Zone
- WQIZ: Water Quality Impact Zone
- SVS: Significant Vegetative Stand
- PRA: Priority Restoration Area
- 50 feet of a wetland or natural drainage
