Know your rights

You have the right to apply for financial help for losses resulting from a violent crime. This assistance does not cover property losses. For application and information, call 651-201-7300. Outside the Twin Cities area call: 888-622-8799 or go to the OJP Website: ojp.dps.mn.gov. TTY: 651-205-4827.

You have the right to request that the law enforcement agency withhold public access to data revealing your identity. The law enforcement agency will decide if this is possible. You have the right, if an offender is charged, to be informed of and participate in the prosecution process, including the right to request restitution (money that is court-ordered from the offender and paid to the victim).

If you feel your rights as a victim have been violated, or if you do not understand your rights or the information presented here contact the Crime Victim Justice Unit at 651-201-7310, 800-247-0390, or cuju.ojp@state.mn.us.

You can ask the city or county attorney to file a criminal complaint.

You also have the right to go to court and file a petition requesting an Order for Protection from domestic abuse. The order would include the following:

- an order restraining the abuser from further acts of abuse;
- an order directing the abuser to leave your household;
- an order preventing the abuser from entering your home (or a reasonable area around your home), school, business or place of employment;
- an order awarding you or the other parent custody of/or visitation of your minor child or children; or
- an order directing the abuser to pay support to you and the minor if the abuser has a court order to do so.

You also have the right to notification if prosecution of the case is declined or criminal charges are dismissed.
