Re: **Construction Notification**

*Hidden Oaks Lane/Woods Trail Area/Coneflower Circle, Improvement Project No.
22103*

The City Council awarded the construction contract for the above-referenced project at their Council meeting on March 8, 2021. The project was awarded to the low bidder, Molnau Trucking, LLC.

Construction is scheduled to begin July 6, 2021 and be substantially complete with yard restoration in September 2021, weather permitting. The contractor plans to start in the Hidden Oaks Lane neighborhood first and will then start work in the Woods Trail/Coneflower Circle neighborhood, a few weeks later. The enclosed construction newsletter identifies general information and the construction phases of the project.

A neighborhood meeting to review the specific construction improvements and anticipated schedule will be hosted in person at City Hall and virtually via zoom. The meeting will take place on **June 23, 2021 from 6:00pm to 7:00pm**. Representatives of the City, the contractor, project manager, and field representative will be present to answer any questions you may have.



- A field inspector will be on-site along with the contractor’s representatives to coordinate access to your driveway and other construction related questions or concerns you may have.

The assessment hearing for the project is planned for September 2021. You will receive notice of this meeting at least two weeks in advance of the meeting date. Hidden Oaks Lane and Woods Trail Area and Coneflower Circle Project

This project includes the residential streets of Hidden Oaks Ln, Hidden Oaks Ct, Oakridge Cir, Aspen Cir, Woods Trail, Blazingstar Ct, Bluestem Pl, Windflower Pl, Woodlawn Pl, Woodlawn Ct, Trillium Ln, Trillium Ct, Ironwood Ct, Red Oak Ct, and Coneflower Cir. Construction is anticipated to start **early July** and be completed in early September.

Construction Activities Include:

- Reclaim the existing asphalt pavement on Hidden Oaks Ln, Aspen Cir, Bluestem Pl and Trillium Ct
- Mill the existing asphalt pavement in all other areas
- Storm sewer improvements
- Spot Curb replacement
- Asphalt street paving
- Watermain valve and curb stop repairs

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q Will I always have access to my driveway?

A Access to all properties will be maintained for the vast majority of this project. There may be times during the day when you may not be able to access your driveway due to utility repairs, street paving, or other work, but generally access will be provided at the end of each day. Following any concrete curb or driveway replacement, access will be unavailable for approximately 7 days. Residents will be provided notification as soon as possible during the project when access will be restricted.

Q Can I park on the street?

A During construction, we ask that all residents refrain from parking on the street. There are certain construction activities, i.e. curb replacement, where you will be required to park on the street. We will notify you prior to curb placement and let you know where you can park.

Q Will delivery or removal service be disrupted (mail service, UPS/FedEx/Amazon and garbage service)?

A The City will coordinate with the Post Office, delivery services, and garbage service during periods of limited access.

Q Where will I be able to pick up my mail?

A During construction, some residents will need to pick up their mail at temporary mailboxes located outside the project limits. Any mailboxes impacted in areas of spot of curb replacement will be salvaged and reinstalled using the existing mailbox and post.

Q Will the areas of my lawn that are disturbed be replaced?

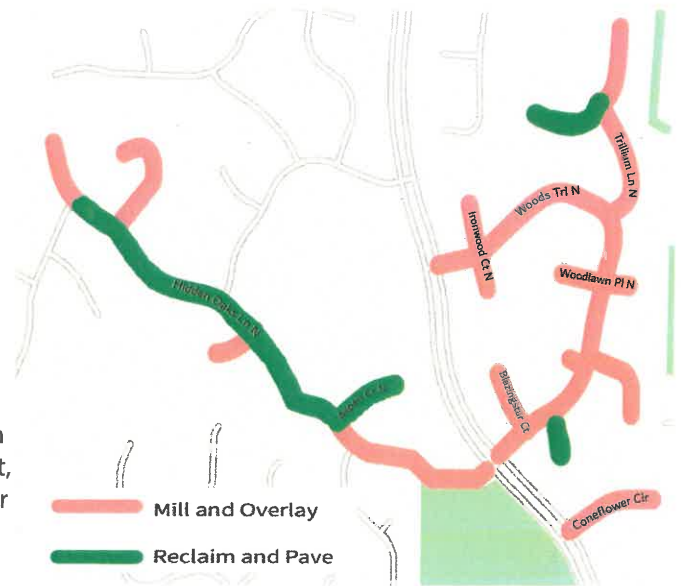
A Sections of maintained lawn that need to be removed for construction will be restored with new sod or seed at the end of the project. The contractor is responsible for watering new sod or seed for 30 calendar days following installation, after 30 days it is the homeowner's responsibility. Residents will receive a letter with the maintenance period end date, as well as tips on how best to care for new sod or seed.

Q How are landscaping features and lawn irrigation systems dealt with during construction?

A The contractor is responsible for protecting hardscape materials and irrigation systems found in homeowners yards, or restoring to their pre-construction condition if damaged. Landscape plants near the curb may be impacted by the project and will not be replaced. If homeowners have plantings they would like to keep, it is recommended they transplant them prior to the project.

Q Will my water be shut off?

A The Utilities Department has reviewed the water services in the project area and is planning some curb stop and valve repairs. This will require water to be shut off in some areas. Residents will receive advance notice if their water will be out of service.

Project Stages

The seven (7) phases of the project are as follows:

Phase 1 – Mailboxes

The contractor will install a cluster of temporary mailboxes for use during construction in select areas of the project for some residents.

Phase 2 – Removals

The next work tasks completed are tree trimming if needed, and mailbox removal. Then existing pavement is ground into a gravel-like material for reuse during reconstruction. Some gravel remains on the street for drivability. Cracked or sunken pieces of curb will be removed.

Phase 3 - Utilities

Installation of underground utilities including storm sewer pipe and catch basin structures. Gate valves or curb stops will be repaired. This work is completed in phases, and access may be impacted.

Phase 4 - Rough grading and curb and gutter

Rough grading of the streets is completed with a gravel surface placed on the subgrade for drivability during this phase. Concrete curb and gutter are placed on the gravel base material.

Phase 5 - Final grading and paving

Fine grading establishes proper slope and depth of the new street. This process is more precise than the initial rough grading. The first layer of asphalt is placed during this phase and driveways are paved.

Phase 6 - Restoration

Turf is restored including any damages to sprinkler systems. The contractor is responsible for restoring areas disturbed with construction. Seed or sod will be used for restoration. The contractor is responsible for maintaining and replacing dead grass during the first 30 days. Onsite representatives inspect the restoration for contract compliance. Restoration issues are identified prior to the end of the contractor's 30-day maintenance period.

Phase 7 – Final paving

Final layer of asphalt will be placed on the streets.

Mailboxes and Trash

Temporary mailboxes will be located outside the project limits. Additional details will be provided before mailboxes are removed. Trash collection should not be impacted by construction.

Working Hours

The contractor is permitted to work between hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday—Saturday. At this time, the contractor does not anticipate working Saturdays during this project.

July 4th and Labor Day

No work will be permitted on these days in observance of the federal holidays.

On-Street Parking

We ask that you do not park vehicles on streets under construction during working hours unless directed by project representatives. Construction can be delayed if the contractor cannot access portions of the project.
